Texas Drawn Hunt Program opens for season

New hunting opportunities and scenery are available to hunters this fall through the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's (TPWD) drawn hunt permits program. The program, which issues permits for drawn hunts on both public and private lands throughout Texas, is now accepting applications for a shot at almost 10,000 permits in more than 60 high quality hunt categories.

Among the offerings available through the Texas Public Hunt System are hunts for whitetailed and mule deer, pronghorn, turkey, alligator and dove and guided packages for exotic species and bighorn sheep. There were 278,000 applications last year.

A new e-Postcard category has been added for predator hunts at the Matador Wildlife Management Area. Applicants for e-Postcard hunts and U.S. Forest Service (USFS) Antlerless Deer Permits must have a current Annual Public Hunt Permit (APH) to apply. APH permits go on sale annually on August 15. Last year, the sale of 55,400 APH permits generated approximately \$2.5 million in wildlife revenue for conservation and public hunting opportunities. An interactive map shows all drawn hunt opportunities by category or by area. All applications, fee payments and permit issuance are handled electronically. To participate, applicants will need internet access, an email address and a credit or debit card. The

customer ID number from the applicant's hunting or fishing license is the most effective way to access the system.

Application fees range from free to \$3 or \$10, depending on the hunt category. Adult hunters who are selected may need to pay a Special Permit fee of \$80 for regular hunts and \$130 for extended hunts. Some categories, such as the Youth-Only hunts, require no application fees or permit fees. Permits are open to resident and non-resident hunters alike.

"Visiting this area of Texas will give young agricultural professionals-farmers, ranchers, business owners, teachers or anyone interested in agriculture-a glimpse into what makes the Hill Country unique," Syntaschk said.

The three-day tour will feature and ranch farm visits. discussions on wildlife and opportunities to network with other participants.

"We need more young people to farm, ranch and work in agricultural businesses and other fields that support the production of food, fiber and fuel," Synatschk said. "The Fall Tour is a great way to meet other young people and learn from each other to take home new ideas and new strategies that we can implement."

Registration closes August 3.

There are two registration packages participants may select from that will include lodging, meals, transportation and the cost of all tours. A third registration package is available for those who do not require lodging.

County Farm Bureaus may help cover the cost of attending the Fall Tour.

Prevent hot car deaths by always checking the backseat

Summer might be a favorite for travel and fun, but it's important to stay safe from torching temperatures in Texas by always checking the backseat and making sure kids are protected from the heat.

As temperatures climb into the triple digits during the Texas summer, conditions can become deadly for people, pets, and especially children.

"We have to remember that children's bodies heat up a lot faster than an adult because of their size, so we need to make sure we never leave them outside in a vehicle," said TxDOT El Paso Traffic Safety Specialist Monica O'Kane.

According to the Texas Heatstroke Task Force, children have died in hot cars even in moderate temperatures, but most deaths occur in the months of June, July, and August, making prevention even more critical during this time.

"Sometimes parents think well, the truck is in the shade, or the air conditioner is on in the truck, or I'm parked under a shady tree, it's okay to leave the child there. And unfortunately, it's never okay to leave the child," O'Kane said. O'Kane educates parents on car seat safety and reminds parents to never leave their children
